 "The Queen of Spotland" is written in a story within a story format, which allows for two worlds – the human world and the world of Spotland – to exist in different timelines and eventually merge with each other.

The book begins with the chapter "A Very Special Gift," which introduces us to 10 year old twins - Sofia and Yanko - and their family. Their Ukrainian grandma comes for a visit and brings a story about Dalmatians to read. This fairy tale consists of 12 chapters.





- 1. The book introduces some Ukrainian words and phrases. Why?
- 2. What does the Ukrainian word *babusya* mean in English?
- 3. How does the weather in this chapter set the mood in the beginning?
- 4. Why are Sofia and Yanko grounded?
- 5. What is Sofia dreaming about? How can her wish foreshadow events in "The Queen of Spotland"?
- 6. How is the theme of use and misuse of technology introduced in this chapter?
- 7. Does Babusya prefer to play computer games or read a book with her grandkids? How about Sofia and Yanko? Confirm your answer with textual evidence.





- A story within a story format is a type of nested format, also referred to as an embedded narrative. It is a literary device in which a main story sets the stage for and then contains one or more other stories.
- Foreshadowing is a literary device where an author hints at or suggests events that will take place later in the story. It is often used to build suspense or anticipation for the reader.
- Textual evidence is information, including quotes, paraphrases, or summaries, taken directly from a text (a book, article, speech, etc.) that supports a claim or argument.
